Skills and Experience

Writing

I have impeccable writing skills, and highly-developed skills in analysis and reporting. In teaching, youth work, directing and managing youth engagement programs, I have always been required to analyse the work I was doing, report on progress and recommend forward strategies. I have prepared letters, speeches, briefs, media statements, articles, reports, strategic plans, proposals, tenders, discussion papers, reviews and many other documents in a professional context. I have written feature articles for *The Canberra Times* and have written regularly for *Australian Stage* and *B2B Magazine*. I am an accomplished playwright with more than ten feature-length theatrical productions in my portfolio as well as unproduced scripts. My plays have been produced by Canberra theatre companies and have been chosen for festivals and other opportunities in Canberra, Sydney, Brisbane, Hollywood and London. I was involved in the preparation of policy documentation for the Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry during my time with the ACT Chamber of Commerce and Industry, and have written media releases for business and community theatre organisations. Communication

I have been building networks for many years, as an industry representative, an advocate for young people and as a dramatist, and retain strong connections in even those networks where I no longer work. I have a strong ability to make people feel at ease when talking with them, and the ability to present information in a personable and engaging manner. I am no salesperson, but I am able to communicate effectively and persuasively with people from diverse backgrounds, especially when it comes to opportunities for developing communities.

Leadership

I have led in a wide variety of circumstances and situations, leading employees, volunteers, students, and more. Most notably I held the position of Director of Employment, Education and Training at the ACT & Region Chamber of Commerce and Industry, where I led a team of professionals engaging the business community in education and training programs as well as providing guidance to government agencies. I was chair of the Partnership Brokers National Network in 2012 and 2013, in which context I provided leadership to representatives of state networks and local providers in 107 regions covering the entirety of Australia. I also led a community theatre organisation as its Artistic Director, as well as serving as director for many theatrical productions during this time and since.

Public Speaking

I have a great deal of experience in front of an audience in a range of contexts. I have served as Master of Ceremonies for national events, notably the Career Development Association of Australia's National Conference, the ACT & Region Indigenous Excellence Awards and the 2019 Out & Loud Festival. I have given presentations in the field of education at a wide range of conferences and events, and I have served as presenter in a series of online educational videos. I have run multi-lingual professional development events for teachers in East Timor, working with translators, and developing basic communication skills in Tetun. I have done voice over work for television advertising, and I have performed in a range of theatrical contexts, including scripted and improvised theatre. My experience as a teacher and leader of community arts programs has also helped develop my public speaking skills to an excellent standard.

As a teacher in an independent parent-controlled school, the relationship between parents and the school is particularly important, and I managed many of these relationships. I have also managed relationships with multi-million dollar clients for the ACT & Region Chamber of Commerce and Industry, with my success evinced by the maintenance and extension of contracts attracting millions into our programs.
